- The 10-Year Framework of Programmes on Sustainable Consumption and Production (10YFP) was adopted at the 2012 World Summit on Sustainable Development.
- It is a global commitment to accelerate the global shift towards sustainable consumption and production.
- SCP is a stand-alone goal (SDG12) of the 2030 Sustainable Development agenda, and Target 12.7 calls for the implementation of the Sustainable Procurement.





## Procurement & plastics

- Plastics packaging is 'procured' directly and indirectly (wrapping primary goods and as part of services)
- Quantifying plastics in public procurement is immensely difficult even where packaging is procured directly (e.g. for catering and food services)

## Main focus is therefore:



#### avoid where possible

e.g. avoid plastic in packaging where feasible, or reduce



#### influence

types of plastics being procured (i.e. recyclable)



#### encourage

markets for recycled plastics – closing the plastics loop



ensure

that plastics packaging is either re-use or recycled to avoid 'leakage'
